

PE and Sport at Horsley Woodhouse Primary School September 2016 – May 2017

This report will show how the funding has helped to increase participation in Sport and improve the quality of P.E at the school, enhancing the overall learning of children.

Horsley Woodhouse Primary School is part Amber Valley Schools Sports Partnership.

A breakdown of money spent from the premium can be shown below.

Curriculum Support

The funding has significantly increased physical activity for all children, bringing in sport and activity specialists expertise has enhanced the opportunities for all children and also increases the knowledge and skills of the staff as they partner with specialists in lessons.

The school receives specialist support for one full day each week.

Through staff questionnaires the curriculum support has been identified as good.

Equipment and Resources

The sports partnership have purchased equipment that is brought to school for the children to use on the days that the PE coach specialist works. These are also accessible if the school requires them on other days.

The school have also purchased school equipment to improve activities and PE and intends to purchase other items in the near future.

CPD for staff

The curriculum coach support is constantly enhanced by CPD provided to the sport and activity specialists who then return to schools to deliver the learning to school staff. Coaches have attended Badminton, Dodgeball and Multi-skills courses so far this school year.

Two members of staff have attended a three day swimming course and are now fully qualified to lead the swimming programme.

In school after school clubs

The school currently receives one sporting after school club and lunchtime club offered by a sport and activity specialist from the Sports Partnership. The clubs are charged at £1 per session. The money generated goes towards sustaining the sports provision in school.

One day a week Premier Sports come in to school to run an additional after school sports club – fencing, archery, dodgeball and athletics.

Additional Activity

The school also benefits from funded opportunities of physical activity.

- Bikeability – Run in school over 3 days with year 6's to gain their level 2 award in bike training.
- Swimming Lessons – Weekly run swimming lessons with year3-6 delivered at the local swimming pool year round.
- 360 Health Initiative – Healthy living coaching delivered by the Sports Partnership.
- Pace Ball – the school received a full day of Pace ball delivered by Central Soccer.
